IV. RESPONSIBILITIES (not meant to be inclusive of all duties to be assigned):

This individual is responsible for performing skilled work in connection with the operation, maintenance, and construction of the Utility's electric distribution system.

- > Installs, maintains and repairs underground distribution and service lines.
- > Repairs, maintains and installs power lines, street lighting, service connections, etc.
- Installs new transformers, air switches and reclosures.
- > Climbs power poles to make inspections, installations and repairs in inclement weather.
- > Assists in the construction of substations.
- Answers trouble calls.
- > Assists in the training of Apprentice Lineworker.
- Performs other related work as assigned.
- V. <u>WORK SCHEDULE</u>: ➤ Generally day shift
 - May be asked to work extra shifts, call outs, or trouble call duty.

- Knowledge of all relevant electrical codes.
- Thorough knowledge of the hazards of the occupation.
- Skill in locating and correcting defects in electrical systems, transformers, appliances, etc.
- Thorough knowledge of standard tools, materials, methods and practices of the electrical trade.
- 3. Required Licenses, Certifications, Training
- Must have a Class B driver's license; subject to random drug and alcohol testing
- Ability to drive and operate all required equipment.

- Ability to understand and carry out written and oral instructions.
